Dear folks,

Here I am again back at the job of letter writing. I have not much to write about, I haven't had any mail in about 5 or 6 days.

We listened to two of the bowl games, played New year day, yesterday.

The Rose Bowl came on at ~~10~~ 11:30 and Sugar Bowl at 4:30. We heard the scores of the other games, given atkins out etc.

I have some more pictures to send you but, I don't know if I will think to enclose them.

We have been getting more shots lately ^(inoculations) and everyone, including myself has a dose soon.

Many of the fellows who are married are going home. I don't think it's quite fair that they should be given 10 points for a wife and none for children. If I was married I would be eligible in 2

months for a discharge. Without a wife it will probably be 6 or 8 months before I am eligible.

most of the fellows who ~~when~~ come overseas with me are already home or they are leaving soon. Many of the men here now have just come overseas. It looks like I will be out here until August, at least, if I am not out in time to start school in Sept. I am going over the hill. I can fly home, I don't think that they will ever find me.
