Dear Felks:

Another month has passed and I hope that by the time that this one is over I will have departed Okinawa. I have been here long enough now to take out citizenship papers.

Nothing much in the way of news. I received two letters again yesterday from you. I guess that they have the mail working pretty well again now, although I still haven't gotten the watch that you sent. I hope that I will get it before I leave.

Tomorrow is pay day and I have \$259 on the books. I think I will draw about \$100 to take home with me as it will be the last chance for me to get paid before I leave here.

I have \$550 at home now and \$250 on books and should get \$500 in mustering out and leave pay if it goes through and I think that it will. That will give me a total of about \$1300 not counting the war bonds that I have bought.

I don't know what I will do with all that money but I think that I will wait a few years until everything cools off and buy a car or an airplane.

The teletype repairmen are here now and are repairing the machine, that is one reason for the incoherentness of this letter. I can't hear myself think as there is plenty of noise going on here.

The mail has come in this morning but it hasn't been sorted yet and I may have seen mail again today.

The mail has just come in and I didn't have any today as there was very little mail.

I am worried about that watch I hope ~~that~~ that you had it insured.

I can't think of anything else to write so I guess that I had better close for now.
